**Temporary Distortion** pushes the boundaries of theater by staging meditative performances in claustrophobic, boxlike structures that bridge the gap between cinema, performance and visual art.

Inspired by Japanese ghost stories and translated through Temporary Distortion's idiosyncratic Western sensibilities, **Americana Kamikaze** features live performers doubled by video doppelgangers in an East meets West psychological horror story.
