Amidst is the second installment of The Painted Bird Trilogy. A live performance and animated video/visual installation, Amidst tackles themes of displacement, otherness and transformation. Amidst premiered at Baryshnikov Arts Center in June 2011. The complete four hour trilogy cycle The Painted Bird (Bastard / Amidst / Strange Cargo) premiered at Wexner Center for the Arts in September 2012 and will have a NYC premiere at LaMama in June 2013. Award-winning choreographer **Pavel Zuštiak** is the Director of **Palissimo Company**, established in New York City in 2004 under his vision to pursue artistic liberty through communion with live audiences. Palissimo is known for sophisticated, multidisciplinary works with piercing emotional content and abundant surrealist imagery that explore "the darker shades of human behavior" (The New Yorker). Palissimo treats each aspect of the production—dance, movement, sound, light, set and video design—as equal. It challenges and engages audiences in rich, innovative aesthetic and intellectual experiences.

Born in the former Czechoslovakia and trained at the School for New Dance Development in Amsterdam, Zuštiak's relocated to the U.S. in 1999. He has won the prestigious 2007 Princess Grace Award, 2009 Princess Grace Residency Award, received the 2010 Guggenheim Fellowship, a 2010/2011 NEFA: National Dance Project Award, a 2013 Alpert Award nomination (his second to date) and was named an ambassador of KOŠICE 2013, European Capital of Culture.

Zuštiak's most recent four-hour trilogy project The Painted Bird (Bastard/Amidst/Strange Cargo) brought together co-producer/copresenters La Mama, Baryshnikov Arts Center, Performance Space 122, Wexner Center and Stanica-Zilina.

Deborah Jowitt of the Artsjournal called the trilogy "extraordinary," The New York Times as "searing," while the Financial Times as "earning its emotional extremity with tenderness and quiet."
